



South African coal is fueling genocide and illegal occupation

- For decades coal has been, and still is, South Africa's primary export to Israel.
- Whilst only amounting to less than 2% of our total coal exports, South African coal amounts to between 15-17.5% of Israel's coal imports.
- Coal makes up around 17% of Israel's total electricity supply.
- The amount of coal sent since October 2023 is now 2.7 mn tonnes (i.e., \$11.1 billion in climate damage).



South Africa brings about legal obligations to end our complicity

South Africa case against Israel to the ICJ under the Genocide Convention

Provisional measures – prevent and punish

Advisory Opinion ruling of the ICJ on illegality of settlements and system of apartheid

UN General Assembly Resolution (September 2024) super majority in favour of sanctions against Israel

Hague Group commitments:

- Prevent the provision or transfer of arms, munitions, military fuel, related military equipment, and dual-use items to Israel;
- Prevent the transit, docking, and servicing of vessels at any port.... in all cases where there is a clear risk of the
 vessel being used to carry arms, munitions, military fuel, related military equipment, and dual-use items to Israel.
- Prevent the carriage of arms, munitions, military fuel, related military equipment, and dual-use items to Israel on vessels bearing our flag... and ensure full accountability, including de-flagging, for non-compliance with this prohibition.

DID YOU KNOW SOUTH AFRICA STILL SELLS COAL TO ISRAEL? Since October 2023, 17 shipments of South African coal have left Richards Bay Coal Terminal to the Israeli port of Hadera. The latest shipment is at sea right now.

THE ISRAELI POWER GRID DEPENDS ON COAL

Coal sales to Israel make up a small amount of our coal exports, but for Israel. South African coal means everything, Israel touts itself as a 'green' utopia but their grid burns coal for about 17.5% of it's output. Burning coal supplies electricity to illegal settlements and military infrastructure, powering the genocide against Palestinians. While South African coal powers the Israeli grid, Israel cuts off power to Gaza – a war crime

MATERIAL SUPPORT FOR A GENOCIDE IS AGAINST THE LAW

Colombia, Russia and South Africa are genocidal apartheid Israef's biggest coal suppliers. Since Colombia has instituted a Coal Embargo on Israel, South African coal made up 48% of Israef's coal imports from January to May 2025, compared to 16.6% in 2024, a 32% increase this year.

The ICJ ruling triggers the legal obligation of all states to end complicity in Israel's illegal occupation and apartheid regime. The Department of Trade, industry and Competition's continued permission for coal to be exported to Israel blatantly contravenes international law.

COAL MINING IS BAD FOR SOUTH AFRICA 🕴

Coal mines poison our society, our water, soil and our air. The bosses get rich but local people live with the social, health and environmental devastation for generations.

CLIMATE CHANGE AND ECOCIDE

1.6 million tonnes of coal releases 3.88 million tonnes of CC₂, pint be atmosphere. Every tonne of CC₂, costs R26.8k in environmental damage. Every 4.34d tonnes of CO₂, causes roughly one climate-related death, which means South African coal sold to Israel has already caused 484 additional climate deaths and R87.5 billion in environmental damage. The bombing campaign in Gaza has emitted 2 million tonnes of CO₂ emissions itself, in the genocide 8 first 100 days the campaign released more emission than 26 countries, combined. By powering the military infrastructure, our coal enables this ecocide.

UN Special Rapporteur highlights Glencore South African coal sales to Israel

Glencore was also involved in shipments from South Africa, (186) which accounted for 15 per cent of Israeli coal imports in 2023 and continuing in 2024 (187).

By supplying Israel with coal, gas, oil and fuel, companies are contributing to civilian infrastructures that Israel uses to entrench permanent annexation and weaponises in the destruction of Palestinian life. The same infrastructure services the Israeli military while it obliterates Gaza, including the network supplying the resources that these companies have provided (204). The ostensibly civilian nature of such infrastructure does not exonerate a company of responsibility (205).

Colombia bans coal sales to Israel!



Colombian President Gustavo Petro has ... [ordered] the Navy to intercept and block all coal shipments leaving Colombian ports en route to Israel. This move comes nearly a year after his government issued a formal decree in August 2024 banning coal exports to Israel, a measure intended to express Colombia's rejection of what Petro has repeatedly called a "genocidal" offensive against the Palestinian population.


Despite the ban, which included limited exceptions for previously approved contracts and customs-cleared shipments, Petro claims that officials within his own administration have continued to authorise coal exports, effectively undermining the government's foreign policy. On Thursday, 24 July, he publicly rebuked this defiance on social media, stating: "They took out a ship full of coal again today, bound for Israel. A challenge to my government. (...) The Navy will receive a written order to stop ships bound for Israel." Later, he doubled down, declaring: "Not a single ton of coal should leave Colombia for Israel."

The president's order has reignited tensions with multinational mining giants such as Glencore, which operates Cerrejón — the largest open-pit coal mine in Latin America and US-based Drummond. Both companies have defended their operations, asserting they are complying with the legal exceptions outlined in the original export ban. However, Petro alleges that internal deception and corporate pressure allowed coal exports to continue unlawfully...

Petro has also called on Colombian society to take a more active role. He urged Labor Minister Gloria Inés Ramírez to convene an emergency dialogue with coal sector unions and emphasised the need to consult with indigenous communities — especially the Wayúu people, who inhabit the region surrounding the Cerrejón mine in La Guajira. "A meeting should be held with the Wayúu indigenous authorities and other communities affected by coal mining," he said. Petro has often tied Colombia's extractive economy to the exploitation and marginalisation of indigenous populations, and his coal export policy is now interwoven with both environmental and human rights concerns.

Therefore, resolve that;

- The energy embargo and call for active engagement with our unions in the energy sector on the non-handling of coal campaign to Israel within a specified time duration.
- The Special resolution on Gaza and ending the genocide - to intensify the global call for an end to genocide and cleansing of Palestinians by the Israeli settler apartheid regime. To find practical ways for the federation and its affiliates to support the people of Palestine.

We call on you to mobilize working class power to end all ties of complicity with Israel and impose concrete and effective sanctions, including:

- •Ending South Africa's coal shipments to Israel.
- •Ensuring South Africa's ports and flag are not used by vessels that transfer essential supplies for Israel's crimes against our people.
- •Pressuring the government to cut diplomatic ties and promote the expulsion of apartheid Israel from the UN by withdrawing its accreditation to the UN General Assembly, similar to what was done to apartheid South Africa.
